Her poetry has been published in the Senior Times magazine and her short story 'The Round Tower' appeared in the anthology 'South of the County: New Myths and Tales' published in November of that same year.

In January, this year Doreen successfully completed an online Poetry course with Oxford University. This course introduced her to a wide range of poems and poetic techniques and enabled her to gain a deeper appreciation of how poetry works. She was also delighted to hear that her entry 'Bluebird' was shortlisted in the Fish Flash Fiction Competition. Doreen will be reading from her work at the Tallaght Library readings at 7pm on Monday November 2.
